Project Description:

The needs assessment process for the Deerfield Police Department resulted in a complete renovation of their facilities while they remained operational. The Deerfield Police Department facilities had not been through a needs assessment process for many years and the village was aware of this as the project process began. Each function and component of the facility was investigated to determine how the PD. had been operating and how they wanted to operate in the future. A comprehensive interviewing process and detailed site and facility surveys guided how the process would proceed. Significant design issues included a critical need for additional space, attention to accessibility, expansion of the communications center, access control, and a long list of specific departmental operational needs. Careful consideration was directed towards each department, shoring up police procedures, and how facility modifications could help the police department accomplish their goals.

The result involved a complete renovation of the existing Police Department and portions of the Village Hall to meet their programmatic

expansion needs and improve operational efficiencies. All existing equipment was investigated and updated if determined to be insufficient for current future and departmental needs and requirements. Since all renovation work took place while the Police department remained in service, this project required Hezner to ensure that dailv functional requirements were met while minimizing the effect of construction on daily operations.
